

DRAFT SCRIPT – VIDEO #2 – I-94 BROOKLYN CENTER CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Crews will be working on the Lowry Tunnel and bridges north of the tunnel for about three months during summer 2017. You will still be able to drive through the tunnel, but

Both directions of traffic will use one side of the tunnel while work is completed on the other side.

When work begins, traffic will be in the eastbound side of the tunnel while crews work on the westbound side. There will be two lanes in each direction between Highway 55 and I-35W. In the eastbound direction, one lane will be for I-94 traffic and one lane will be for I-394 traffic. All large trucks will be detoured to I-35W, Highway 62, and Highway 100. During this time

If you are going west on I-94, you will not be able to get off the freeway at I-394 or at Highway 55. You will not be able to get on westbound I-94 from northbound I-35W or 4th Avenue. All other ramps will be open.

When work is finished on the westbound side of the tunnel, all traffic will be moved to that side while crews work on the eastbound side. There will be two traffic lanes in each direction between Highway 55 and I-35W, and large trucks will be detoured. During this time

If you are going east on I-94, you will not be able to get on the freeway at Highway 55 or I-394, and you will not be able to get off the freeway to go south on I-35W. You will still not be able to get on westbound I-94 from northbound I-35W or 4th Avenue. If you are going east on I-394, you will not be able to get on eastbound I-94. All other ramps will be open.

There will be signed detours for all ramp closures.

Crews will work seven days a week and may work 24 hours a day. People who live, work, or worship near the Lowry Tunnel may hear noise, feel vibration, and see bright lights.

Please be patient and drive carefully through the work zone.
